# Who Do I Contact?

### LAPC Sheriff's **Office for:**

Robbery, Burglary, Aggravated Assault, Gang Violence, Arson, Drug Crimes, etc.

## **Either/Both** for: Sexual Assault, Hate Crimes, Domestic/ **Dating Violence**, Stalking

## **Campus or District** Administration for:

**Discrimination and/or** Harassment Based on: Race, Color, National Origin, Religion, Sex/Gender, Physical or Mental Disability, Age (40+), Genetic Information, Marital Status, **Sexual Orientation and** Identity, AIDS/HIV Status, Medical Condition, Military or Veteran Status, or Status as a Victim of Domestic Violence, Assault, or Stalking Under California Law

#### Community, Campus, and Confidential Support Services

#### **Community Support**

#### Law Enforcement

- Call 911 if you believe you are in imminent danger.
- Call your local police department if you would like to report a crime, file a restraining order, etc.

#### Medical Care

If you require medical treatment and/or STD testing, go to a hospital, the LAPC Student Health Center, or a community resource, such as the Santa Monica UCLA Rape Treatment Center.
