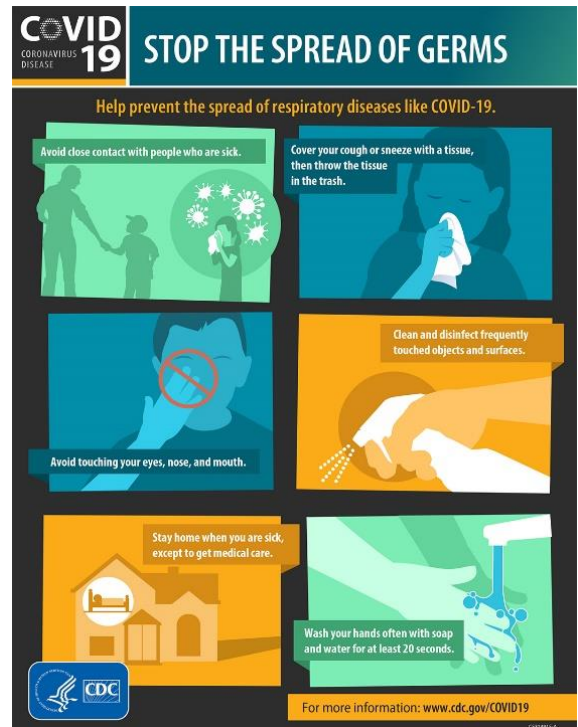


### I. District Updates

#### Coronavirus / COVID-19 Update

The safety of our students, faculty and staff is a top priority for the Board of Trustees, the Chancellor, the College Presidents and Executive staff and preparedness for this issue is being given the highest level of attention by District officials.

The District and all nine colleges are working together to help prepare for any responses, as appropriate, regarding the spread of the 2019 Novel Coronavirus and the associated COVID-19 respiratory illness. Chancellor Rodriguez announced the formation of a districtwide COVID-19 Response Team that will help the District and the colleges assess and implement (if needed) emergency plans; address continuity of operations and health & safety concerns; staffing & absenteeism issues and communications to students, faculty and staff.



The District and the colleges have been actively engaged with the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health since special telebriefings for education officials began January 23, 2020. Several districtwide messages has been sent to faculty, staff and students since January 31 and information is available on the websites for the District and the colleges. The colleges are also using informational posters such as the one seen here, above, in key walkways around the campuses and on social media platforms.

## LATTC Groundbreaking

Members of the LACCD Board of Trustees, the Chancellor and other officials from the District and Los Angeles Trade-Technical College (LATTC) gathered with an overflow crowd for a festive groundbreaking celebration on Feb. 25, 2020 highlighting the start of the single largest building project to be undertaken by the BuildLACCD program. Board Vice President Steve Veres and Trustees Mike Fong and David Vela joined Chancellor Rodriguez and Dr. Katrina VanderWoude—on her first week as LATTC's newly installed President—along with about 200 students, faculty and construction trades representatives for the “turning of the dirt” celebration.



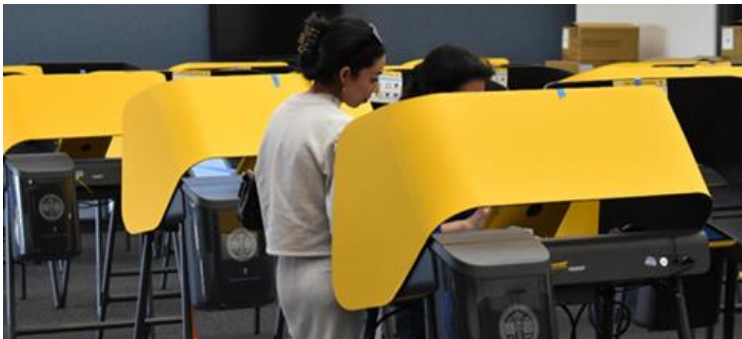
The new LATTC “Construction Technology Building” will be a four-story, 178,555-square-foot building with a strong green component thanks to a 54kw rooftop photovoltaic (solar electric) power system and eventual certification as a LEED Gold structure. The facility will include 23 classrooms, 22 laboratories, a fully usable roof-top laboratory, office space for more than 45 faculty members, conference rooms, extra storage rooms and an adjacent instructional construction yard. The \$108 million building will house under one roof the largest pathway program for LATTC—the Construction, Maintenance, and Utilities (CMU) Pathway, including programs for carpentry, electrical, construction and maintenance, heating ventilation and air conditioning, plumbing and refrigeration, supply water and wastewater, architectural drafting, power line mechanic and solar installation. The new building will replace the aging, 47-year-old Sequoia Hall with state-of-the-art educational resources for the construction trades.

### Voting Centers at all Nine Colleges

All nine colleges hosted new Voting Centers in collaboration with the County of Los Angeles Registrar of Voters Office for California's March 3 Primary Election. Los Angeles City College and Los Angeles Mission College each hosted 11-day centers while the remaining seven colleges had the four-day centers. While the centers were operated by County staff and temporary poll workers, District personnel were involved for several months with behind-the-scenes logistical and public information support to make the centers available for students, faculty, staff and the public to use. College and District officials are already talking to the County about hosting similar centers for California's General Election on November 3, 2020.

### Census Kiosks at All Nine College

The self-service kiosks will provide a convenient alternative for students and the public to complete the Census Forms online instead of by mail. The District and the colleges are working in conjunction with the Joint City-County of Los Angeles Complete Count Committee and the State to host the kiosks.

### LACCD Job Fair Success

More than 200 people attended the recent LACCD Information Job Fair hosted by the Human Resources Division on February 22 at East Los Angeles College. Attendees heard from Board Trustee Mike Fong and Chancellor Rodriguez about career opportunities with the District and its

nine colleges. Tables for the colleges also provided a variety of information presented by college representatives.

### **BuildLACCD - Building Lock down Buttons**



On Thursday, February 6, East Los Angeles College successfully tested the new system that allows for a remote building shutdown using an emergency lockdown button installed in the Campus Safety Office. Upon activation by Campus Security during this emergency simulation, the buildings with electronic access control capabilities locked down in less than 10 seconds and the automated system immediately sent email and text messages to safety personnel, alerting recipients of the lockdown

situation. An abort feature was successfully tested bringing the system back to its regular state, eliminating the need to go from building to building to manually unlock buildings.

The test was performed as part of a bond-funded project in coordination with ELAC Administration, ELAC Information Technology, ELAC Facilities, District Safety, the Los Angeles Sheriff's Department, and BuildLACCD. This technology will be part of the Districtwide Phase II-Door Lock and Building Access Control project currently in design for the remaining Colleges.

## **II. District Updates for Basic Student Needs**

The unique collaboration by Los Angeles Southwest College, local construction firms and Los Angeles World Airports (LAX) continues to successfully help provide local students with key building trades education, apprenticeships and job opportunities—addressing their needs for well-paying jobs and economic mobility. LACCD Board President Andra Hoffman was the keynote speaker at the graduation ceremony.

Hoffman told the audience the program between LACCD, LAX, construction firms and the LA/Orange County Building Trades continued to “break down barriers for women and people of color to successfully enter into the construction industry.”

Surrounded by friends and family, 27 students of the HireLAX Apprenticeship Readiness Program's seventh cohort graduated on Feb. 28, marking their successful completion of a transformative eight-week course that prepared them for apprenticeships in the union construction trades. Like the previous cohorts, the current graduating class is diverse and inclusive of local community members who have faced



challenges in their lives. The graduates of Cohort 7 include: 18.5% female; 26% who identify as African American; 52 who identify as Hispanic/Latino; 3.7% who identify as American Indian and nearly 41% of the graduates indicating they had some form of prior involvement with the criminal justice system.



### III. Update on the LACCD Enrollment

#### A. Winter Enrollment

Winter 2020 FTES is projected to increase by 457 FTES (9.2%) compared to Winter 2019.

#### B. Spring Enrollment

As of Day +14 of the Spring semester [comparing Spring 2020 (2/23/20) to Spring 2019 (2/17/19)] for the District:

- Credit Headcount is unchanged
- Duplicated Enrollment is unchanged
- Section Count is 1% lower
- Enrollment per Section is 1% higher

#### C. Enrollment Management

The District is in the process of completing its Student Responsive Enrollment Management Plan with the colleges and will be presenting the 2020-2021 targets, process, and strategies at the IESS Committee meeting March 25.

#### IV. Reports from the College Presidents (based on the District Strategic Plan 2018-2023)

##### Goal 1: Access to Educational Opportunities

- **Los Angeles City College**—On February 3, LACC hosted the Local District Central Counselors Summit providing LAUSD counselors information about LACC.
- **Los Angeles Mission College**—One of LAMC’s students from the College Culture Re-Entry Hub assigned to Barry J. Nidorf Juvenile Hall (BJN) recently earned his associate degree with Cum Laude honors. In celebration of his achievement, the L.A. County Probation Department hosted an emotional graduation ceremony to recognize this monumental moment. This youth was the second student in 2019 to earn an Associate degree from Los Angeles Mission College while at Barry J. Nidorf. On average, more than 120 students are enrolled in any given semester with various post-secondary partners.
- **Los Angeles Valley College**—The College’s Outreach Team held “LA Valley College Day” in February and is continuing its efforts in March at local feeder high schools, to promote L.A. College Promise program, boost enrollment and complete financial aid applications.
- **Los Angeles Harbor College**—The College reports that its Special Programs and Services has added more than 100 additional students for the 2020 Spring Semester.
- **East Los Angeles College**—The College’s First Year Center, in partnership with financial aid outreach and counseling, completed the first of several Welcome Days on campus. The purpose is to invite local high school seniors on campus so they can experience the ELAC campus, attend workshops and begin preparing for college.
- **Los Angeles City College**—Welcome Week occurred Feb. 10, offering extended Student Services office hours, club previews and “Express” Counseling resources for students.



##### Goal 2: Premier Learning Environments

- **Los Angeles City College**—LACC’s Theatre Academy production of *The Sandstorm* performed at the Kennedy Center American College Theatre Festival’s Region VII Festival on the Cal State Fullerton campus from February 11 – 15.
- **Los Angeles City College**- In February, LACC hosted a number of Black History Month celebrations including an African Drum Circle, a discussion on “Unleashing Youth Power to End Female Genital Mutilation,” and presentations from actor Bill

Duke and Dr. Shaun Harper, Executive Director and Founder of USC's Race and Equity Center.

- **Los Angeles City College** – On February 19, LACC signed an agreement with the UCLA Herb Alpert School of Music for a transfer pathway for music students interested in pursuing their bachelor's degree from a four-year institution.
- **Los Angeles City College** – On February 24, actor Morgan Freeman visited the LACC campus for a re-dedication of the Morgan Freeman Lecture Hall and an interview/discussion with Mr. Freeman for LACC students by the Hollywood Foreign Press Association. The event was attended by Chancellor Rodriguez, LACC President Mary Gallagher, Interim Deputy Chancellor Melina Nish, plus several other District and LACC officials.



- **Los Angeles Valley College**—Child Development faculty Dr. Elmida Baghdaserians and Dr. Veronica Getskow presented at the 10<sup>th</sup> Annual Early Childhood STEM Conference in Pasadena, Calif., on February 28. Their topic “Teacher Must-Reads to inform Best Practices in Early Childhood Education (ECE)” focused on issues related to equity, poverty and mental health in ECE.

- **Los Angeles Valley College** - LAVC Umoja Black Scholars hosted a series of events for Black Heritage Month, including a cultural celebration with African dance, drum circle and soul food, and keynote address by award-winning actor/director William Allen Young. There was also a movie screening and panel discussion of *Just Mercy*, a 2019 American Legal Drama about the true story of Walter McMillian, who with the help of young defense attorney Bryan Stevenson, appeals his murder conviction.







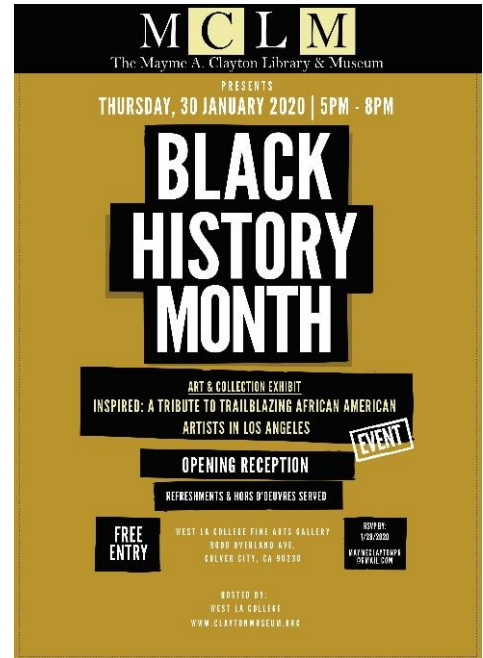
- **Los Angeles Valley College**—The LAVC Art Gallery also recently hosted a panel discussion and opening reception for its latest exhibition, *Beyond the Blue*, on Wednesday, February 12. *Beyond the Blue*, on display from February 12-March 7, 2020, is a traveling group exhibition of more than 100 works of art created by incarcerated participants in Prison Arts Collective (PAC) programming in California state prisons.



- **Los Angeles Harbor College**—The College hosted a special “24 and 8” event in honor of Kobe Bryant, his daughter, their “Mamba” legacy and the seven others who died recently. This event was held February 21. Local high schools were also invited to see Harbor College vs Compton College Women’s Basketball Game.
- **West Los Angeles College**—A2Mend founding member and current parliamentarian Dr. Walter Jones reports that LACCD Chancellor Rodriguez will give the welcome address at the organization’s 13<sup>th</sup> Annual A2Mend Summit. The local [press coverage praised](#) the exhibit, the Jan. 30 event and the partnership between WLAC and MCLM. At the end of the month, WLAC and MCLM co-hosted a free screening of “Black Orpheus” followed by a panel presentation. The 1959 film is significant in that it was the first internationally acclaimed film to take place entirely in a *favela*, with an all-Black Brazilian cast and featured a soundtrack by famous Brazilian singers Antônio Carlos Jobim and Luiz Bonfá, who pioneered the new style of *Bossa Nova*. 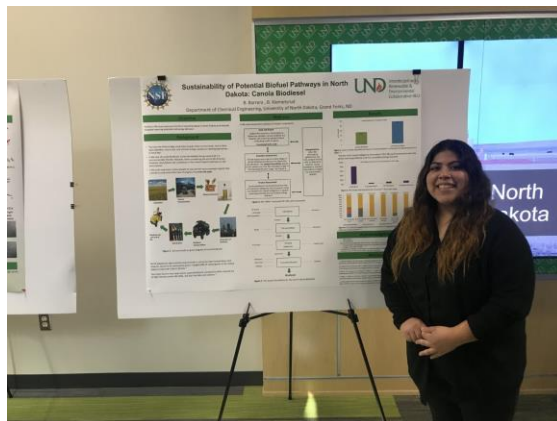
from Mexico and started her education with the fashion program at LATTC. She also has done costume design for the films ***Thor: Ragnarok, Avatar and World War Z***
