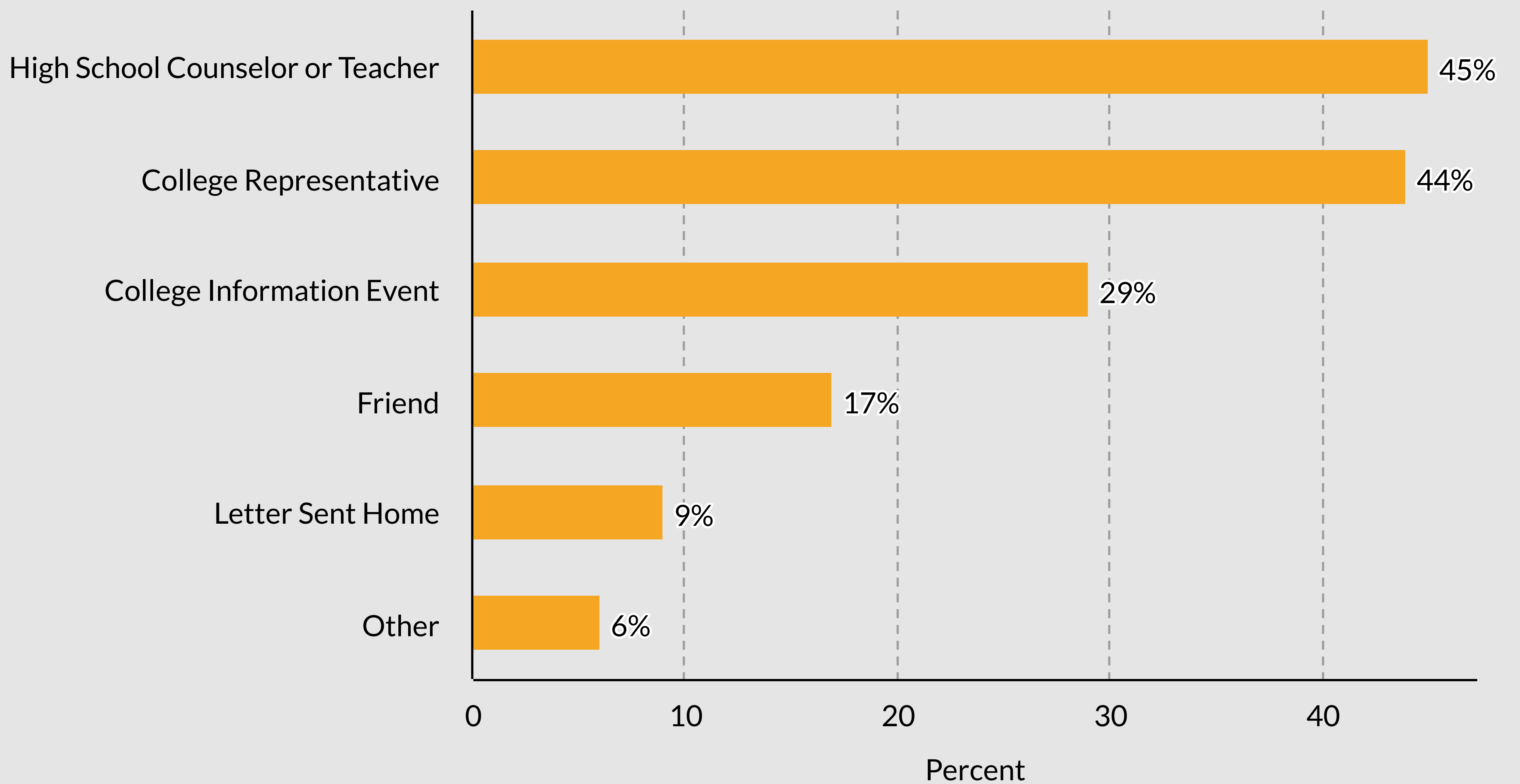
[FALL 2019 SURVEY]

The Los Angeles College Promise (LACP) Program conducted a survey of first-time Promise Students (N = 5,873) during the Fall 2019 term. The purpose of the survey was to learn about students' experiences with the program and understand what services they need to achieve their personal goals.

There were 1,102 students who participated in the survey (18.8% response rate). The majority of the students were female (65.2%) and Hispanic (80.3%).

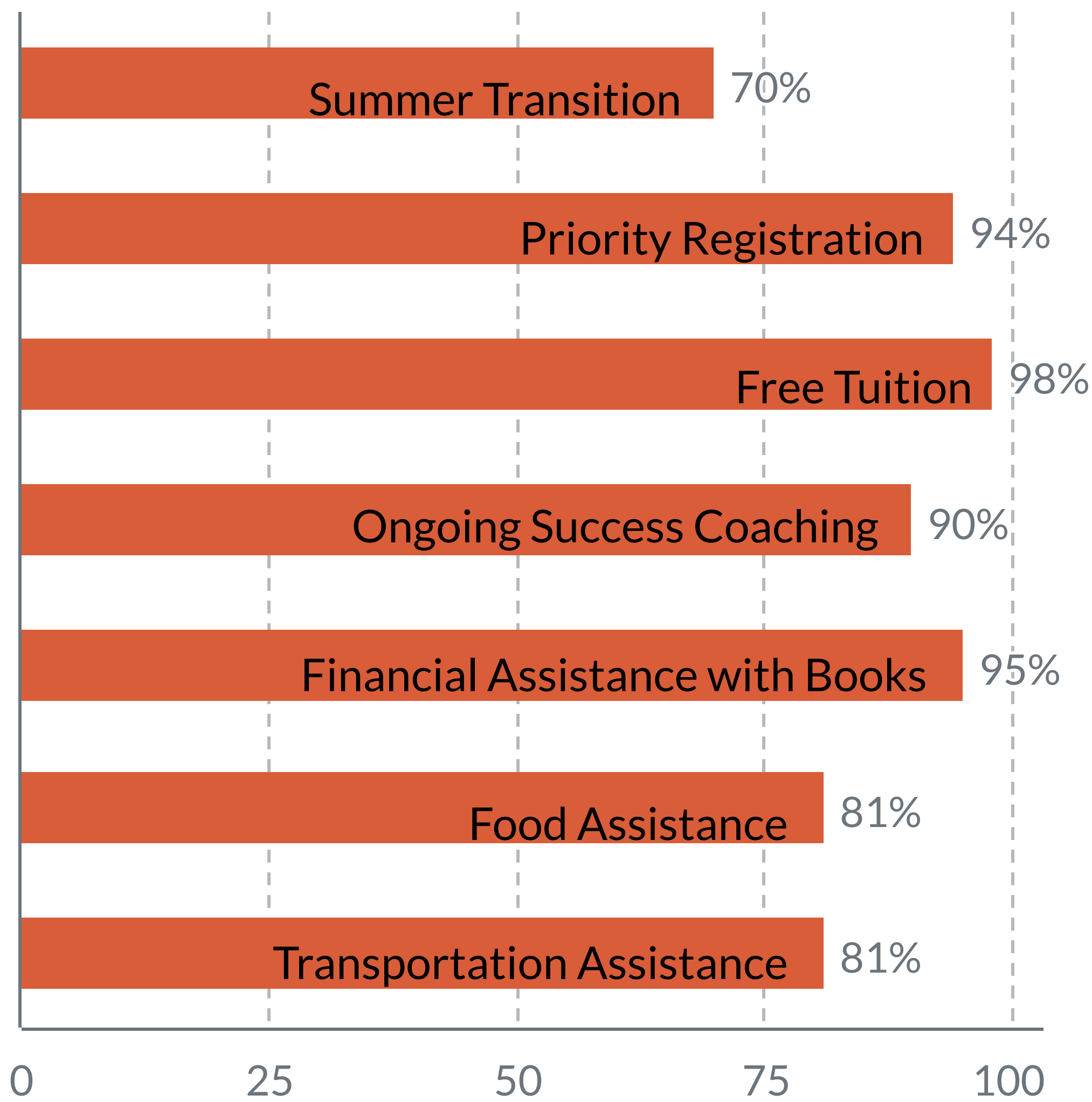

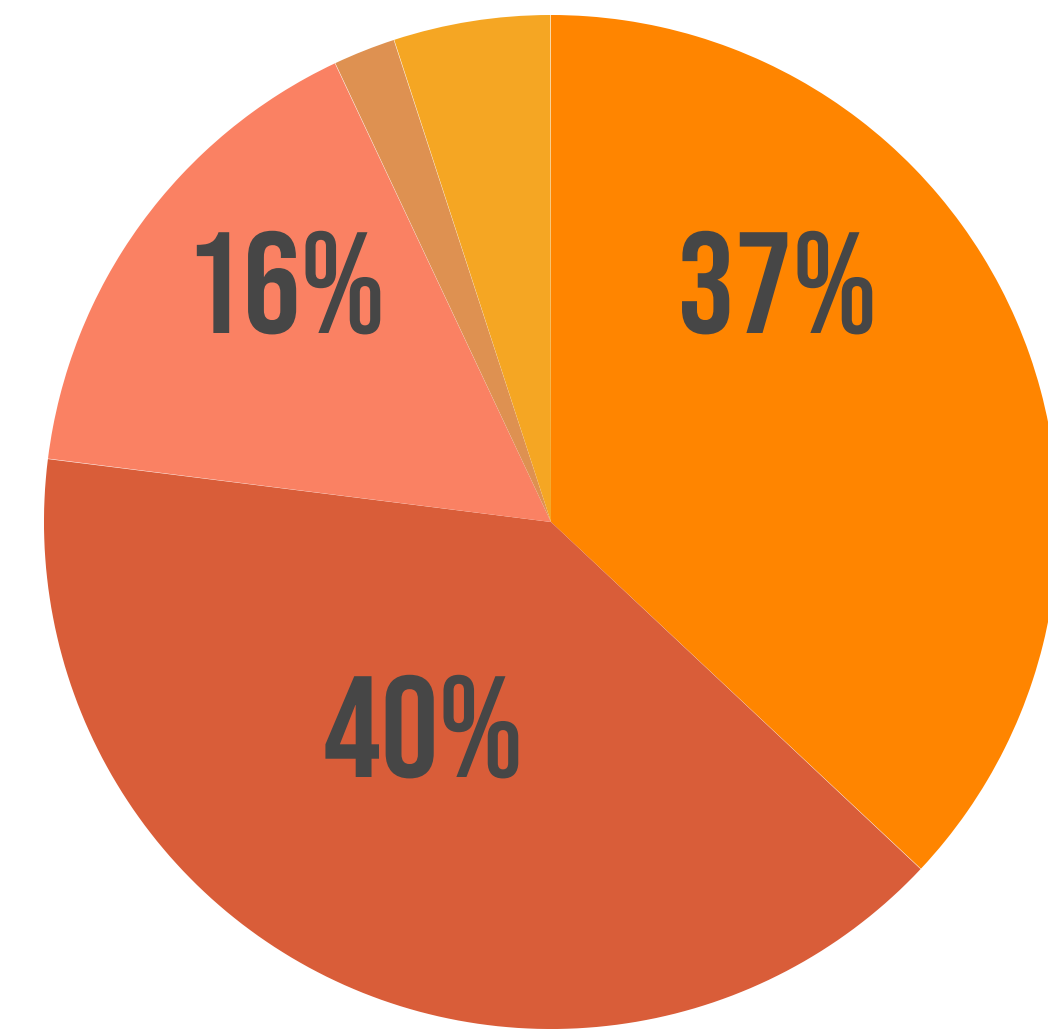

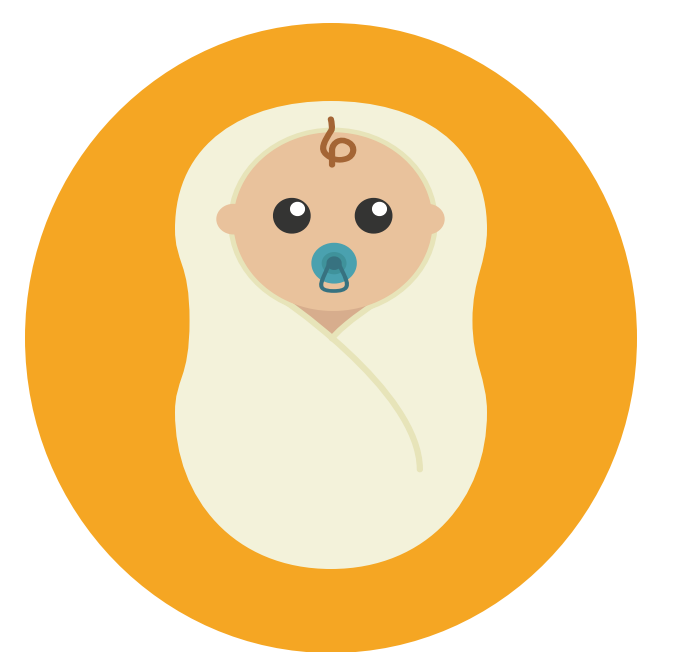
