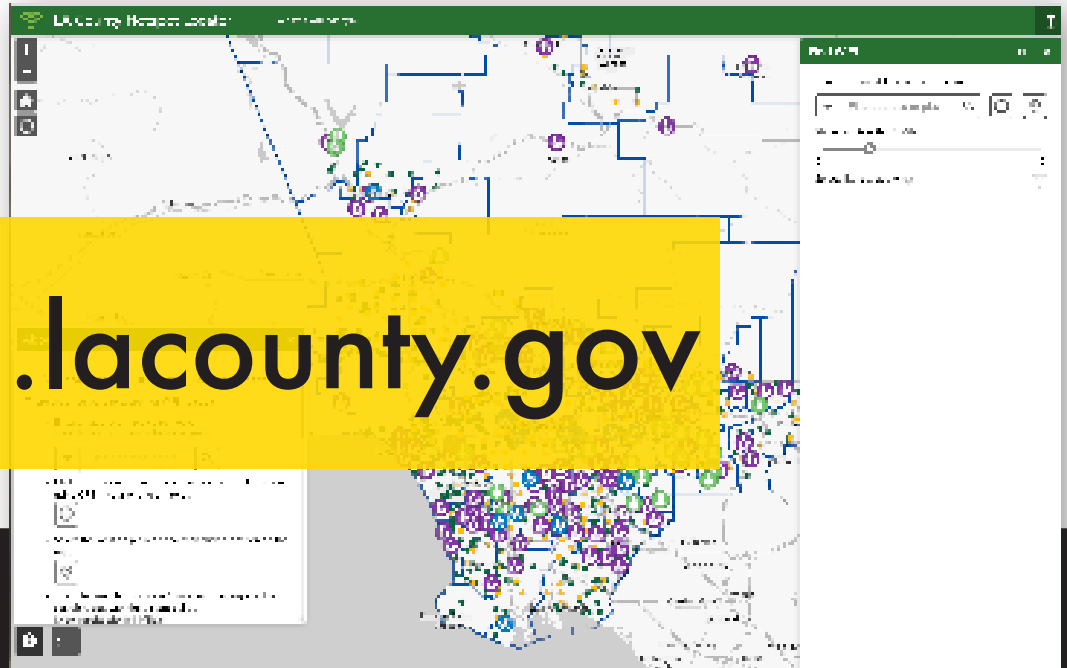
Low-Cost Internet Service Providers (Commercial)

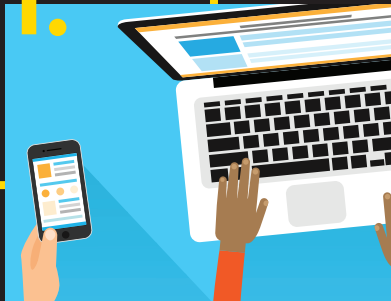

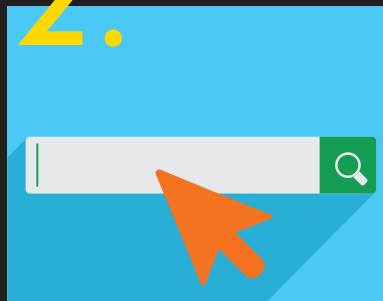

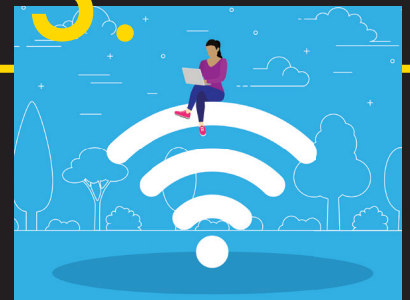
