"We are proud to recognize your dedicated leadership in working to ensure a strong transfer pathway on your campus."

L.A. Pierce College has created Associate Degrees for Transfer in thirty disciplines. Students get priority consideration from a California State University (CSU) campus for acceptance into their major to complete bachelor's degrees after earning only 60 units at Pierce.

"It is an honor to be named a 2020 Champion for Higher Education by the Campaign for College Opportunity," said Los Angeles Pierce College President Alexis S. Montevirgen. "We are proud to be recognized for our efforts to empower students to reach their education goals through the Associate Degree for Transfer."

The ADT was designed to provide a streamlined pathway between the state's community colleges and the CSU system. Compared to traditional transfer students who enroll in the CSU, ADT transfers earn their bachelor's degree nearly twice as fast.

L.A. Pierce College Articulation Officer Cristina Castelo Rodriguez says Pierce has many people to acknowledge for this achievement.

"This is very exciting news, to be a leading community college in awarding students the Associate Degrees for Transfer!

"I would like to acknowledge the diligent work of our Counseling Department Faculty members. They encourage and collaborate with students to work towards these



degrees. They are knowledgeable about what courses from other institutions can be applied towards these degrees, ensuring that students are able to finish them at L.A. Pierce College."

Rodriguez went on to thank faculty, curriculum, admissions and communications team members who made it possible for students to take advantage of the ADTs.

"All of these constituents' hard work is reflected in the dramatic increase in ADTs awarded from 319 in 2015-2016 to 1000 degrees in 2018-2019. It is such an honor that LA Pierce College is acknowledged for all of our endeavors."

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ELAC Awarded as 2020 Champion of Higher Education

MONTEREY PARK, CA – East Los Angeles College (ELAC) has been named a 2020 Champion of Higher Education by The Campaign for College Opportunity for exemplary work in implementing the Associate Degree for Transfer (ADT). ELAC has shown a dedication to transfer students and this award is a validation of that effort.

The ADT provides a streamlined pathway between the California Community Colleges and the California State University (CSU) system. Compared to a traditional transfer student, ADT transfers earn their bachelor's degree nearly twice as fast from a CSU. 798 ELAC students earned an ADT in the 2017-2018 school year and that increased to 1,088 students in the 2018-2019 year. That was once of the largest increases for any California Community College.
