
Courses & Workshops Designed Specifically for Current and Future Instructors and Project MATCH Participants

Mission Statement: The District Academic Senate (DAS) Professional Development College (PDC) is designed to improve and/or develop competencies of current and future community college instructors. This program will offer skill sets that are important for meaningful and effective teaching and learning. Faculty already have prior degree and/or industry experience, subject matter expertise, and professional development experience. However, faculty may need further formalized instruction on how to teach and improve student learning.

The PDC has been offering a series of seminars beginning in Winter 2016. It will offer courses which are CSU-transferable. (Note: These credit courses may be used for pay column advancement.)

PD COLLEGE COURSE ORGANIZATION

The **PD College** is made up of five tiers, containing 1-3 stackable courses, leading to a **certificate**. All courses are degree-applicable and CSU transferable.
