**STUDENTS REMINDED THAT “LATE-START” CLASSES BEGIN APRIL 9, 2018**

LOS ANGELES—Students attending classes within the Los Angeles Community College District (LACCD) are reminded that registration remains open for “late-start” classes that begin April 9, 2018. Students should sign up now for the best selection before the classes fill up or are wait-listed.

“Late-start classes can help jump-start your college education,” LACCD Chancellor Francisco C. Rodriguez, Ph.D., said. “They can help you meet your general educational requirements, let you advance more quickly to obtain your two-year degree, earn a specialized training certificate or transfer to a four-year college or university.”

All nine of the LACCD colleges offer a variety of these short-term, accelerated courses. The classes are about eight weeks long, but pack a full schedule and course materials to meet the requirements for semester credit upon successful completion of the class.

Prior to registering, students should check their academic calendars to verify that the late-start classes they want to take do not conflict with the days and times of final exams for other classes they are already taking in the Spring 2018 Semester.

Registration is on a first-come, first-served basis. Some classes may already be full or wait listed, so don't delay. Questions about financial aid, tuition or fee waivers should be directed to the colleges.
