### **COVID-19 RESPONSE UPDATE**

- L.A. County Department of Public Health focus is now on vaccinations – Phase 1A currently able to reserve appointments for healthcare and 65 and older, but demand exceeding supply
- For Phase 1B, including the Education category, appointments could begin in mid- to late-February
- LACCD Educational services remain status quo with remote learning platforms and some limited, in-person instruction for essential workforce classes. Spring 2021 Semester begins Monday, February 8, 2021!
- The District's Emergency Operations Center (EOC) and the colleges' Incident Command Centers remain activated



# COVID-19 RESPONSE UPDATE, continued

- New recovery <u>"Re-engagement</u> <u>Grid"</u> document for the District and colleges developed & online
- EOC reviewing all 21 <u>Safety</u>
   <u>Advisories</u> issued since
   pandemic declared in March
   2020 to update & revise
- Promotion of SAFE app for the colleges continues
- CCCCO just released support for additional PPE supplies





# LEGISLATIVE AGENDA

- LACCD pursuing an ambitious state legislative and budgetary agenda in 2021 –announced in news release February 1
- Six legislative policy priorities and seven budget priorities, including:
  - housing insecurity and homelessness
  - funding for Ethnic Studies programs
  - four years of tuition-free education at CSU campuses
  - broadband access
  - textbook cost reduction
  - Umoja funding





## FOUNDATION UPDATE

The Foundation for the Los Angeles Community Colleges (FLACC) gives record amount of assistance to students.



2,700 Grocery Cards were mailed to students

- Collaborating with Imperfect Foods Inc., the Foundation delivered:
  - 970 Boxes of Food and Groceries to students in December
  - 2,442 Boxes of Food and Groceries to students in January



# **FOUNDATION UPDATE (continued)**

### In the last three months, the FLACC disbursed:

- 201 Vicky Chang NCLEX awards to Nursing Students
- 105 Ann and Robert Ronus Nursing Persistence Grants
- 13 scholarships to respiratory therapy students
- 123 Emergency Grants
- 183 LA College Promise Grants

### And --

- processed and evaluated 11,000+ applications for assistance
- \$1 Million grant from the California Community Foundation and generated \$410,000 in contributions



### CAMPUS SAFETY UPDATE

- Moving forward with a comprehensive and inclusive assessment of campus safety and security needs for the District
- Goal = assessment completed during the next four to five months
- Assessment serves as foundation for a campus safety and security services RFP
- Goal = new multi-year districtwide provider Board approved and in service by January 1, 2022
- More details about the assessment will be announced later this month.


