## COVID-19 STATUS, VACCINATIONS

# L.A. County Enters Yellow Tier May 5

- Hospitalization rates down, positive cases down, new death totals very low, vaccination rates continue to climb
- State and County Health Officials agree all signs point to "Yellow Tier" status
- Last step in statewide reopening "Blueprint"
- Revised Health Orders to be issued effective May 6
- Under review for implementation ASAP
- Steady progress towards moving out of pandemic

All indications are this remains on track



## COVID-19 STATUS, VACCINATIONS

#### Vaccinations Status

- More supply than demand
- More than 8 million doses administered in L.A. County
- LACCD's City, East, Mission
   Pierce and Southwest colleges
   continue important roles as
   testing or vaccination sites
- OGC currently reviewing possible mandatory vaccination recommendations
- Urge all LACCD personnel to get vaccinated now –Stay Safe Campaign





#### LACCD RE-ENGAGEMENT PLANS

- Re-Engagement Plans
  - Planning assumption remains Yellow Tier and 50% on-site instruction and student services for Fall 2021 Semester
  - Using District Re-Engagement Grid as guide
  - Likely move past all color-coded "Blueprint" June 15 with opportunity for more in-person activities in Fall 2021 Semester
  - Per state law, District must track for COVID-19 cases beyond pandemic for next two years
  - Situation mains dynamic. We must remain nimble.



#### LACCD RE-ENGAGEMENT PLANS

- District Agility and Stability
  - Health and Safety as Priority
  - Direct Student Assistance
  - District and College Operations
  - Aided by Federal and State COVID Funds
  - Strong local partnerships with City and County
  - Working with all bargaining units for return to inperson instruction and services





#### LACCD RE-ENGAGEMENT PLANS

- New Check-In at Colleges
  - Per State law, District must have reporting ability to health officials for any new COVID-19 outbreaks for next two years, post-pandemic
  - Starting May 3, all colleges using "SAFE" app for smartphones & tablets, or online forms to replace gated, inperson check points





#### A SEASON OF CELEBRATIONS



On April 28, 2021, the White House announced that President Biden had nominated **Jeffrey Prieto**, the District's General Counsel, as his selection to become the next **General Counsel for the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA).** 

Mr. Prieto's prior federal government service spans 20 years for a variety of agencies and departments, including under the Obama-Biden Administration, he served as the Senate-confirmed General Counsel of the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA).

He was a White House Fellow assigned to the Secretary of Health and Human Services; an Attorney-Advisor at the EPA's Office of Water; a Trial Attorney, Counsel to the Assistant Attorney General, Deputy Executive Officer, and as General Counsel in the Environment and Natural Resources Division (ENRD).
