II. District Status on COVID-19 Public Health Emergency & Recovery



Vaccination Clinics

All nine colleges are hosting COVID-19 vaccination clinics during the month of June. This will be the first time that all nine colleges will provide vaccinations in a coordinated effort across the District at the same time. The coordinated effort comes at the request of the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health for the colleges to help get LACCD students and their families vaccinated as well as to help serve the communities immediately surrounding each college. Demand for the clinics will be assessed at the end of June and operations could be extended.

Los Angeles Pierce and Los Angeles Southwest colleges continue to work in partnership with the Los Angeles City Fire Department for clinics through the end of July. Los Angeles Harbor College is teaming up with Providence Health while East Los Angeles College is designated to work with Rite-Aid as part of the Biden Administration's nationwide coalition of large community colleges to offer vaccines.

Los Angeles City College, Los Angeles Mission College, Los Angeles Trade-Technical College, Los Angeles Valley College and West Los Angeles College are working with the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health (LACDPH) to be teamed up with vaccination providers, including Kedren Health and Wesley, among others, to provide clinics ranging from one to several times per week.

Anyone age 12 and older is eligible to be vaccinated. In many cases, appointments are no longer needed and walk-ups are being accepted. People who get vaccinated at the colleges will be eligible for the state's newly announced <u>"Vax for the Win"</u> incentive program. The colleges are also working on other student-focused incentives such as credits at the colleges' bookstores. More details about the incentives will be announced soon.

Demobilization Efforts

The District's Emergency Operations Center (EOC) and the colleges' Incident Command Centers (ICCs) are moving into the demobilization phase of the response to the COVID-19 pandemic as California Governor Newsom's <u>statewide reopening plans for June 15</u> nears. As demobilization occurs, functions within the EOC-ICC structure will begin to cease and pre-COVID operations will begin to resume.

The EOC and the ICCs will work on an After Action Report and Improvement Plan that will look at the District's overall response to the pandemic during the past 15 months, including recommendations for improvements to how the District and the colleges respond to similar emergencies in the future. It is expected that the report will be finalized by September.

The District is also awaiting safety changes from the county and the state, including from <u>CalOSHA</u>, which is expected to announce new interior workplace safety measures for facial coverings and social distancing on June 3.

Yellow Tier Status Remains

Until further clarification is made by health officials, Los Angeles County, including the District, remains in the Yellow Tier, per LACDPH <u>Health Orders dated May 14, 2021</u>. Specific reopening <u>Protocols for Institutes of Higher Education</u>, dated May 11, 2021, also remain in effect. Planning guidelines for the District's Fall 2021 Semester also remain aligned with the Yellow Tier criteria although LACDPH expect to provide more changed and updates on or about June 15.

Safety Is Our Priority

As the pandemic subsides and a return to pre-COVID conditions begins to occur, creating safe, in-person places for all District personnel and students to work, teach and study is a key priority for the recovery plans for the District. Much of this effort is led by the District's Facilities, Planning and Development Division, in coordination with the colleges' facilities, custodial and maintenance and operations staff. Examples include:

- Vent cleaning all locations before August
- Deep cleaning & sanitization all locations
- HVAC filter upgrades
- Altering HVAC sequence for outside air where possible
- Custodial dispatch and staffing for daily cleaning of classrooms used
- Ensuring cleaning and PPE supplies available
- Coordinating with colleges for fall schedules and cleaning needs

Mandatory Training for Return Post-Pandemic



As part of a safe return to pre-pandemic conditions, the District has developed a mandatory training module for all personnel and students per state requirements. The training is about an hour and the goal is to have all training completed prior to the start of the Fall 2021 Semester. Communications and outreach to staff and students is under development to explain the need and purpose for the training.

III. Updates on LACCD Enrollment & Marketing

Enrollment

A. Summer Enrollment

Comparing Summer 2021 (5/31/21) to Summer 2019* (5/27/19) as of **Day -14** of the semester, for the District as a whole:

- Headcount is at 86%.
- Duplicated Enrollment is at 84%
- Credit Section Count is at 102%
- Enrollment per Section is at 83%

*Comparison of Summer 2021 to Summer 2020 is distorted due to the relatively early start of Summer 2021 and compressed time frame of this term compared to Summer 2020. Summer 2019 enrollment data compared to Summer 2021 is provided as more accurate timeline comparison because of these compression issues. Registration is ongoing and the Summer Session begins June 14, 2021.

B. Fall Enrollment

Fall Semester 2021 priority and tiered registration began May 24, leading up to open enrollment which starts June 18, 2021 and continues until the Fall Semester begins August 30, 2021.

C. District-wide Enrollment Marketing & Advertising Campaign

Timing of the Campaigns

Summer Campaign: May 19 to June 23

Fall Campaign: June 23 to about Sept. 7

Both campaigns extend into at least the first week of each summer or fall semester, options to extend depending on funding. This is a collaborative approach with colleges to blend any specific niche campaigns per college

External Marketing & Outreach

The District's marketing and advertising agency is creating targeted messaging with "pointed" persuasive messaging for social media, traditional media and direct messaging for the following audiences:

- Latinos (bilingual), African Americans, Asian American and Pacific Islander students ages 18 to 35 and their parents
- L.A. County residents with intent/CC focus
- 4-year college students
- Expanded use of social media platforms, Spanish-language radio, L.A. Sentinel advertising

Internal Retention and Recovery

The campaign is creating college-specific messages and calls to action to existing students not yet enrolled to each college's website. Specialized enrollment lists provided by EPIE to target specific student populations (by college and segmented by ethnicity) includes:

- Winter 2021 enrolled students
- Applied not enrolled in Summer / Fall 2021
- Stop-outs
- Dual enrolled students (Concurrent HS students)
- ESL students

LATTC Marketing & Advertising Displayed on Iconic Reef Building in Downtown Los Angeles



One of the most visible digital electronic marketing and advertising billboards in Downtown Los Angeles can be seen for miles just south of the 10 and 110 freeways. These high-definition, digital, state-of-the-art video displays are among the largest in the region and sit atop the 12-story Reef building.

Thanks to a long-standing partnership involving the Reef, LATTC and the L.A. Mart Management, the college has leveraged that partnership into adding several FREE displays of LATTC

enrollment marketing messages. During the COVID-19 pandemic, the college has received approximately eight (8) weeks of FREE sign displays which is visible from Boyle Heights to Midtown. Normal retail value of this prime advertising venue is about \$200,000.

Los Angeles Mission College Receives \$509,000 Grant from National Science Foundation




The National Science Foundation has awarded Los Angeles Mission College with a \$509,000 Advanced Technological Education grant to help increase the number of qualified biotechnology workers and establish educational pathways for adult learners returning to school, college officials announced.

The project, titled "Expanding the Biotechnology Pipeline to Adults Seeking Reemployment," seeks to increase the number and quality of skilled biotechnology workers to fill the regional workforce

demand, and establish classroom to career pathways for adults who lost their jobs during the COVID-19 pandemic, said Chander Arora, Ph.D., the program's director and a Life Sciences faculty.





Graduation Drive-By Events
