



SNAPSHOT

- LACCD operations are consistent with State & County orders, and District Recovery Plans are underway
- LACCD Emergency Operations Center (EOC) and Colleges' Incident Command Centers (ICCs) active since March 19
- Spring Semester Finals now, Summer Session starts remotely on June 18
- Fall Semester 2020 begins August 31, possibility of limited oncampus activities depending on L.A. Public Health guidance

- Lassen County was first to "Open" Now First to "Re-Close"

*L.A. is epicenter of COVID-19 for California, about half of all cases and deaths

COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES

- L.A. County is in transition from Stage Two to Stage Three
- The County has a Five Stage Roadmap for Recovery
- The situation remains fluid, and LACCD staff are monitoring closely to ensure the District is aligned with current orders

Five-Stage Reopening Process Based On Risk

Stage One

Safer at Home Order Planning for Recovery

Stage TwoNow

- Florists, some retailers, car dealerships, golf courses and trails
- Other low-risk businesses (manufacturers, offices, retail)
- Essential health care
- Outdoor recreation and libraries
- Museums, cultural centers, galleries

Stage Three

TBD

- Higher-risk businesses (body art, massage, bars/ nightclubs)
- Movie theatres and bowling alleys
- K-12 Schools
- Colleges and universities

Stage Four TBD

 Highest risk businesses (entertainment venues)

- Large conventions
- Sporting and spectator events

Stage Five

TBD

Fully normal operations



COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES

Stage Three requires colleges to implement social distancing protocols and the use of PPE per Public Health, including:

- Face coverings
- Maintaining six feet of distance
- Testing and contact tracing
- Quarantine and isolation for exposed individuals
- 30 40 students for inperson with distancing

Protect Yourself and Others from COVID-19

HOW TO WEAR A FACE COVERING



- Wear your face covering so it comes all the way up close to the bridge of your nose.
- Make sure it covers your all the way down under your chin.
- Do your best to tighten the loops or ties so it's snug around your face, without gaps.

HOW NOT TO WEAR A FACE COVERING



DON'T: Wear your face covering so it is below or covers just the tip of your nose.



DON'T: Leave your chin exposed.



DON'T: Push your face covering under your chin to rest on your neck.



DON'T: Wear your face covering loosely with gaps on the sides.



Very limited inperson instruction for hard to convert courses; first priority are courses that did not convert to remote delivery in Spring 2020; second priority are hard to convert priority courses for Fall 2020. Some level of inperson but not completely restored. Restored with higher risk activities allowed.

Fully normal operations after completing all prior stages by meeting preestablished deadlines.


