

COVID-19 / STATISTICS

As of October 7, 2020:

- We remain in a declared state of emergency due to the COVID-19 coronavirus pandemic—Now at Day 204
- Six-month milestone occurred September 19, 2020 just as the nation recorded more than 200,000 deaths
- Fall 2020 Semester began Aug. 31 with return to limited oncampus instruction for specific classes to support California's essential services workforce infrastructure
- Chancellor announcement in September to all faculty, students and staff that educational delivery and business operations must remain in remote environments and online for Winter and Spring 2021



COVID-19 / STATISTICS

As of October 7, 2020:

L.A. County stats

275,856 positive cases, 6,681 deaths

In LACCD:

- 169 positive cases
- 1 fatality (no change)

L.A. County remains in state's most restrictive Tier 1 Status due to tracking data.
