

COVID-19 UPDATE

- COVID-19 Public Health Emergency
 - 2 Year Anniversary, entering third year
 - Omicron Surge Peaked in January
 - LACCD about 1,200 cases in January—more than 2020 and 2021 combined
 - Emergency Orders remain in place, but cases down, vaccinations/boosters up, maybe turning the corner
- Colleges Prepared for Spring 2022 start Feb. 7 with plenty of masks and other supplies for employees and students
- District nears full compliance with employees for vaccines, new requirement for boosters in place
