


















DAY 13 - RELATIVE TO THE BEGINNING OF INSTRUCTION



### AB1613 - DEVELOPING BIOTECHNOLOGY BACCALAUREATE DEGREE AT PIERCE

#### PIERCE AWARDED FEDERAL FUNDING TO DEVELOP BIOTECH BACCALAUREATE DEGREE

We are excited to announce the passage of a \$2 million earmark for Los Angeles Pierce College to partner with BioCom and regional employers to establish a new approach to biotechnology higher education, including a baccalaureate degree.

With AB1613, Pierce will develop, pilot, and implement an innovative interdisciplinary program to meet the needs of the more than 4,000 employers in the rapidly expanding bioscience sector in Los Angeles County.

The program will include stackable certificates aligned to industry certifications, associate degrees, and a new baccalaureate degree in Biotechnology with several areas of concentration. This new degree will enable the diversity of students to earn the academic credentials and job skills essential for career progression, leadership roles, and income growth in a dynamic program tied to the emerging needs of biotechnology employers.

### Los Angeles Pierce College Multicultural Center

The Multicultural Center will serve as a place where all students are welcome to gather, according to Center Coordinator Tatevik Melkumyan. It currently houses Umoja and Brahma Bodega, with other programs in development.

"We are thrilled to be opening our doors and look forward to supporting our students academically, professionally, and socially through engaging and impactful programs and services," Melkumyan said.

Our mission statement: The Multicultural Center engages students in the development of knowledge, awareness, and skills about multiculturalism and cultural competence. We promote intercultural learning and celebrate diversity to foster an inclusive community.















#### **Enrollment campaign**

During the month of January 2023, LASC is engaging in a marketing campaign to encourage students to enroll for Spring 2023. The campaign includes a bulletin, poster, and four bus tails. The bus tails will be displayed on Metro buses within the LASC service areas.

#### **Mathematics, Engineering, Science Achievement Grant**

On January 18, 2023, LASC was awarded the Mathematics, Engineering, Science Achievement (MESA) grant. The grant will be funded for five years for a total of \$1.4 million dollars through the State Chancellor's Office. 
#### **Registration Wednesdays are Here!**
