


Dear LACCD Colleagues,

On July 12, 2023, two LACCD-sponsored bills were passed by the Senate Education Committee. AB 506 (Fong) Community College Ethnic Studies Bill will push a reset button on the Community College ethnic studies course approval process, enabling a more collaborative and transparent process in approving community college courses that meet Subject Area F for students transferring to California State Universities. The bill passed 6-0 from Committee and was referred to the Senate Appropriations Committee. AB 1096 (Fong) Native Language Instruction passed the Senate Education Committee with a vote of 6-0. This bill will increase access to high-quality post-secondary education by enabling community college students to take classes in their native language without requiring them to take a concurrent ESL course.

On July 16, 2023, Governor Gavin Newsom signed AB 1151 (McKinnor), another measure sponsored by LACCD. The bill requires Community College Districts (CCD) to give priority access to the use of college facilities/grounds to organizations, clubs, and associations serving people from socioeconomically disadvantaged communities. In addition, it allows the CCD to grant facility use to specified organizations without charge. The bill also authorizes the governing board of a community college district to require a certificate of insurance to raise the minimum coverage amount of \$1 million.

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## ELAC Department of Psychology and Addiction Studies Program Awarded \$8.1 Million in Grants

ELAC Psychology Department and Addiction Studies program was recently awarded \$8.1 million in grants. This is the largest ever received by the department and also one of the largest grants awarded in ELAC history. There has been a **shortage of Addiction Counselors** in the United States and ELAC is ready to bolster the workforce. A portion of this grant will also go to the ELAC Foundation to help train and place addiction counseling interns.

# ELAC Department Psychology and Addiction studies program will receive the following grants:

- \$6.1 million from the Health Care Access and Information (HCAI) Department to train and place a total of 158 Substance Use Disorder (SUD) counselors over the next 3 years. Grant partners in the Substance Use Disorders Earn and Learn (SUDEAL) project include the Amity Foundation, Cuesta College, CRCD, LA CADA treatment center, NewWays toWork, and Helpline Youth Counseling.
- \$1.5 million from the Division of Apprenticeship Standards (DAS) to administer a 3-year Substance Use and Behavioral Disorders Apprenticeship Program (SUBDAP). ELAC's SUD Apprenticeship program was recently approved by the State's Department of Labor and this project will significantly increase employment opportunities for Addiction Studies graduates.
- \$203,000 from the Justice and Careers Opportunity Department (JCOD) to continue the College to Careers Bridge program targeting persons who have been impacted by the criminal justice system and helping them earn a certificate in Addiction Studies.
- \$135,000 awarded to the ELAC Foundation to train and place Addiction Counseling interns at Helpline Youth Counseling's Mentored Internship Program (MIP)
- \$60,000 was awarded to the ELAC Foundation to process stipends for the SUBDAP grant.
- \$150,000 was awarded to the ELAC Foundation for the ELAC Cares Grant, helping youth start their career pathway in the Addiction Studies Field.

#### ELAC Pathway to Law School Program Partners with Local Law Firm for Internship

Three East Los Angeles College (ELAC) students were selected to be interns with a local law firm. Gina Zapanta and Mike Alder of Z.A. Lawyers worked with ELAC's Pathway to Law School professor Ken Chaiprasert to identify students for the internship.

Gina and Z.A. Lawyers created monthly real-life law situations that were embedded into the Pathway to Law School program. Students Angela Romero, Monique Ortega, and Jayro Nunez were a part of the students who completed all the monthly exercises and were the three selected by Z.A. Lawyers to start the paid internship this summer. Gina Zapanta has close ties to ELAC and wanted to make sure this internship opportunity focused on community college students. Her father, Dr. Richard Zapanta, was born and raised in East Los Angeles and graduated from Garfield High School and ELAC before going on to receive his medical degree from USC. Dr. Zapanta built a respected legacy of philanthropy and civic leadership while also mentoring high school, college and medical students. His Legacy Fund Scholarship provides financial assistance to ELAC students each year.

The interns will also be experiencing real-world law problems and work. They start with an overview of the firm and then are consistently placed in high-interaction spaces where they work directly with clients of Z.A. Lawyers. This helps to give the interns first-hand knowledge of what different needs are required for each case.

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### Congressman Cárdenas Presents \$2 Million to LA Mission College to Increase STEM Workforce Programs

On July 7th, U.S. Rep. Tony Cárdenas announced \$2 million in Community Project Funding to Los Angeles Mission College (LAMC) to increase STEM Workforce programs.

The goal of the project is to expand the current offerings of the Allied Health programs to meet the workforce and demand in the community while supporting non-English speaking, foreignborn STEM workers and those new to or interested in STEM fields.

Assemblymember Luz Rivas, LACCD Trustee Nichelle Henderson, LACCD Chancellor Francisco C. Rodriguez Ph.D., and LAMC President Armida Ornelas, Ph.D., were all on hand to praise the Congressman for securing the much-needed funding.

"This grant enables us to provide direct student support, removing a significant barrier, and incentivizing student success," said LACCD Chancellor Francisco C. Rodriguez, Ph.D.

"This is a tremendous investment in L.A. Mission College and will directly support our new shortterm Allied Health certificates, which include EKG Technician, Licensed Vocational Nurse, and Phlebotomy Technician," said LAMC President Armida Ornelas, Ph.D.

The grant will allow Los Angeles Mission College to develop a new site in Pacoima which will offer Allied Health certificates alongside ESL and GED courses.

#### CCC Chancellor's Climate Series Talks Kicks Off at West

As June came to an end, California Community Colleges Chancellor Sonya Christian kicked off a series of climate change events at West Los Angeles College in partnership with the college's California Center for Climate Change Education.

"Here at West Los Angeles College, the Center for Climate Change Education is setting a precedent for high-profile work in climate. The Center will now prepare students for good-paying jobs...West LA's Associate Degrees in Climate Science are a first of their kind and they are designed with a curriculum that can be adapted and adopted by other colleges across the state," said Christian.

The conference, attended by nearly 200 state, education and community leaders, was titled "California Community Colleges and Climate: Defining the Possible." The focus was on defining priorities for the California Community Colleges in addressing climate change mitigation, adaptation and resilience.

Speakers included Ben Chida, Deputy Cabinet Secretary, Office of the Governor – and community college alumnus; Stewart Knox, Secretary of the California Labor & Workforce Development Agency; Glenda Humiston, Vice President for Agriculture & Natural Resources, University of California; and our own LACCD Chancellor Francisco C. Rodriguez and WLAC President James M. Limbaugh.









LA Promise Summer Transition Slots Full

Nearly 240 recent high school graduates have signed up for the Summer Transition Program required to be part of the \$0 tuition LA College Promise Program. The six cohorts of 40 students each spend a week at West exploring their interests, participating in interactive career-focused workshops, completing orientation, receiving counseling and crafting their two-semester education plans, submitting their FAFSA or CA Dream Act applications, and enrolling in 12 or more units. During this process, several students have been matched to internship opportunities. One student from the first cohort has been hired by BuildLACCD and another is interviewing for several open positions.

West is hosting several events throughout the summer to encourage the community to browse, enjoy and discover us. On July 4th, the Culver City Exchange Club Fireworks Show was again held at West.
