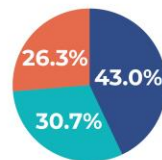

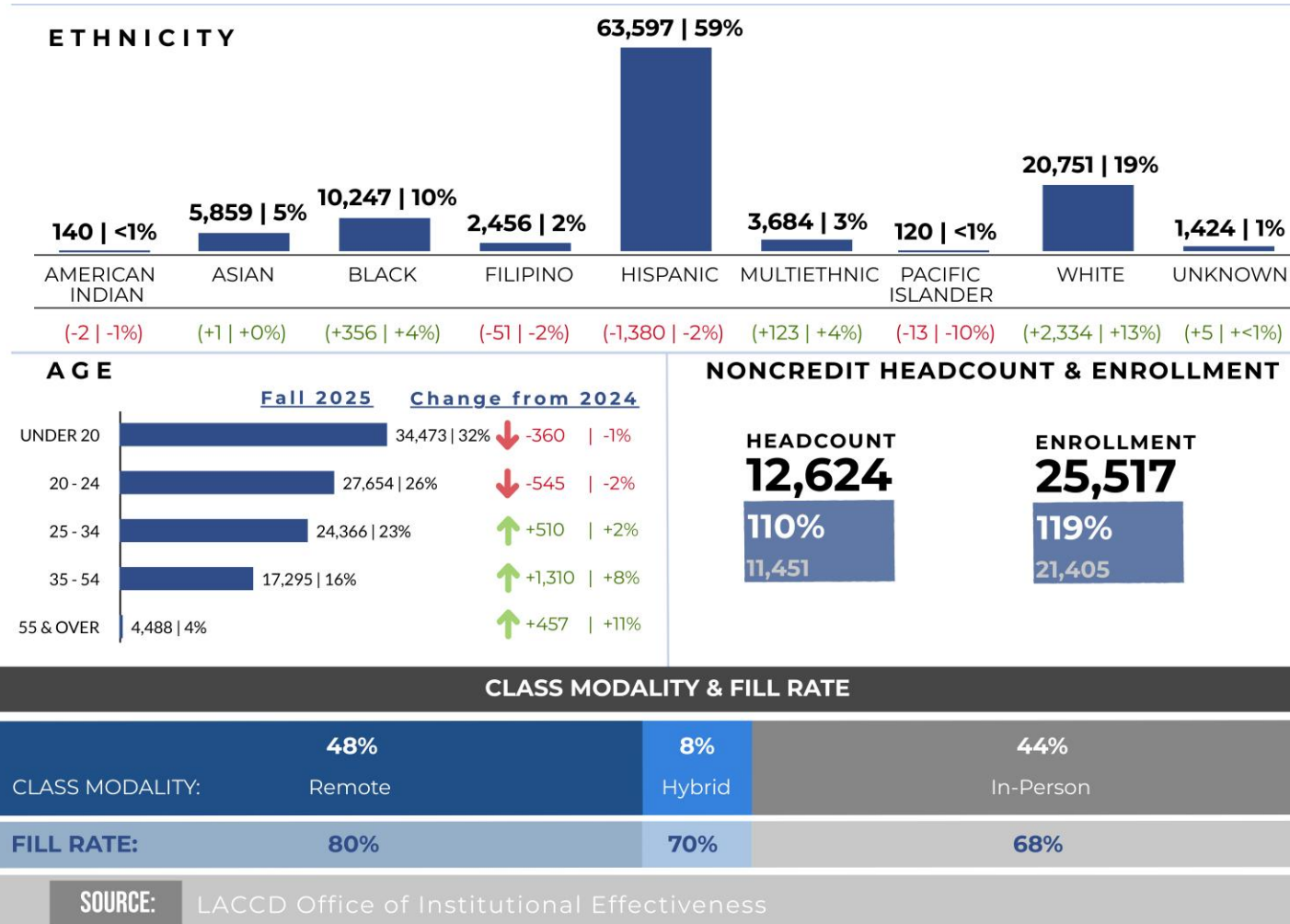

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Clean Energy & Sustainability - Key Goals & Achievements

- **Renewable Energy:** The district is working on electrifying the central plants and is aligning Measure LA funds with the institutional energy resource plan. The LAMC Plant Facilities Shop and Warehouse is a net-positive project with solar providing over 115% of the facility's average daily use.
- **Green Buildings:** New buildings are required to achieve LEED Certification and have 15% of their consumption powered by renewable energy. There are 58 LEED-certified buildings across the colleges.
- **Transportation:** LACCD's goal is for 50% of vehicles to be zero-emission vehicles by 2030. They also plan to add nearly 540 electric vehicle charging stations across all nine campuses.
- **Waste & Water:** By 2030, the district aims to reduce total waste generated by 20% and divert 75% of waste from landfills. A key project is the LASC Reclaimed Water Project, which irrigates approximately 20 acres and cuts potable water use.
- **Student and Community Involvement:** The program includes sustainability internships where students can work on projects related to food/waste, transportation, and community outreach. The district also works with community partners on projects such as the native plant microforest at West Los Angeles College (WLAC).
